About the Speaker:

Ms NG Yee-mei, Nora is the senior manageress of Aberdeen Kai-fong Welfare Association Social Service Jockey Club Integrated Service Centre and her work focus is on the services of children and youth. Over the past few years, she took charge of the CIIF funded Keychen Up youth pre-employment and mentoring project (躍動工房計劃)* which bridged cross-sector resources and networks to support the at-risk youth.

About the Workshop:

Youth mentoring has become the popular working approach or intervention to support the youngsters to examine their identity in United States and United Kingdom recently. Recent studies revealed that youth mentoring brought greater benefits particularly for the atrisk youth who were poor grades in school and were from the low-income and underprivileged family than the average youth.

This workshop is going to give you an overview about the relationship between the social capital and the youth mentoring. The local youth mentoring experiences under the CIIF-funded Keychen-up youth preemployment and mentoring project will be shared as well.
