About the Workshop:

An overview on the nature and management of critical incidents, including the nature of critical

incidents, responses in face of critical incidents (cognitive, emotional, behavioral & biological); differences between Critical Incident Stress Debriefing (CISD) and Psychological First Aid; The eight core actions of Psychological First Aid, and the "Dos" and "Don'ts". The workshop includes demonstrations on "Emotional Management Techniques" by means of Role Play.
