#### About the Seminar:

The emphasis on individual counselling often leads to the misperception that a counsellor works only with a single client and in secrecy. This seminar aims to raise awareness that in reality counsellors work within a multitude of relationship networks. Using the example of doing counselling in school, and by unfolding how a teacher with counsellor training maneuvers her way through multiple roles, multiple contexts, and interdisciplinary conflicts, just as the Monkey King with his seventy – two transformations, using ever-changing strategies and methods in helping students with multiple problems, issues regarding who really is the client, given a person is never an island on his/her own, then confidentiality and its limits, and questions in interdisciplinary cooperation can be re-addressed.



#### About the Speaker: Ms. Peony Chiang 蔣佩儀女士

Ms. Peony Chiang was trained as a teacher, and has taught Business subjects for 16 years in a local secondary school. She obtained the Master of Social Sciences (Counselling) degree at HKU in 2006. Before becoming the Vice–Principal of her school in 2015, Ms. Chiang has extensive experience in working with students and their families to support students with behavioral, emotional and mental health issues.

She applied her knowledge and skills in counseling, and promoted the whole school approach to student development, adopting a multi-disciplinary approach and encouraging teachers and social workers to work with other helping professions, including speech therapist, psychologist, psychiatrist and EDB specialists. As she serves as a member of the school management team, she further practices her learning in counseling in staff management and conflict resolution. She was Chairperson of the Alumni Association in 2012-14, and has participated actively in social services of the Association in the last decade and beyond.
